We were attending the Race of Gentlemen (TROG) last weekend, (10-15, 15, 16) in Pismo Beach. This is a special event open only to cars 1937 or earlier, and motorcycles 1942 (I think) or earlier. The cars were mostly Model "A" or flat-heads. They were all carefully reviewed before allowing them to enter. They have to meet specs with no modern upgrades. There were 150 cars entered in the event.

It was attended by 13,000 people. It was the first time they've tried racing on the beach in CA. They race annually in New Jersey. The weather was drizzly and rainy and the tide was so high it held up the race on Sat. and they couldn't run at all on Sunday. The picture was just one of the entries in the event. Because of what he named his car I had to send you the picture. (*The name is Rusty Nut in case you can't read it!*)

A MUST READ: Background for this article: At the ARC OPEN HOUSE, Zane expressed an interest in maybe pursuing a career in photo journalism focused on things “automotive.” We (my husband Mike and I) arranged a meeting at ARC through our friends John and Maureen Toomey, parents of Mike Floyd, who is the Editor of AUTOMOBILE magazine and the author of the article. The meeting was planned to be about an hour on May 7th, 2016, but lasted about 4 hours as Zane showed a lot of interest, presented a number of interesting ideas, and asked many pertinent questions about pursuing a career in photo journalism. Interestingly, Mike Floyd’s wife, Tammy, who was also in the meeting, is an editor/top writer for the WALL STREET JOURNAL. Between them, they presented a lot of good ideas and professional advice to Zane plus offered him personal editorial help and guidance as he gets his engine started and begins to produce copy. THE TRUCK HEALS



AT FIRST GLANCE, ZANE CHILDRESS, a slightly built, soft-spoken teenager with a flat-billed cap shading his tanned, angular face, seems much like any other young man preparing to face the world after high school. The Phoenix-area native is also obsessed with his wheels, a tight, burnt-orange 1972 Chevrolet C10 pickup.

But it’s the battles he’s fought in his lifetime and the story of how his Cheyenne came to be restored that make Zane’s story unique and inspirational.

Cancer is a devastating disease that has no doubt touched most of you reading this in some way or another. Maybe a family member has had it, or a friend. Or you’ve lost a loved one to it. It’s a nasty, horrible thing we all wish could be eradicated. It’s especially devastating when it afflicts a child. Zane was one of them.

You wouldn’t know it by talking to him; he’d much rather just keep it to cars and where he’s headed in life, but the scars are there. He’s been dealing with the disease since he was very young and fought like hell for years as it ravaged his body. With the help of some experimental treatments and the love and support of his mother, Michelle, and countless others, he’s come out the other side and the prognosis is good.

During the darkest days, the times when they weren’t sure he would survive, in many ways the truck kept him going. It was his late grandfather’s Cheyenne, one of the only things he left behind, so it held even more significance. Zane dreamed in the hospital of all of the modifications he’d make.

His mom was desperate to get the truck built the way Zane wanted and turned to the Make-A-Wish Foundation to help make it a reality. For a number of reasons, it didn’t quite work out, and it dampened Zane’s spirits during a low point in his treatment. But she never gave up hope. “I always thought somehow a miracle would happen,” Michelle said. It did. Make-A-Wish contacted Herb Clark, the founder and president of the Automotive Restoration Club of Sun City West, just outside of Phoenix, and he gladly offered to help.

Founded in 2011, ARC has an interesting backstory. Sun City West has a metalworking club, and some of the members were doing automotive work there. It got Clark thinking there might be interest in an automotive restoration club, and he decided to pursue it. Some thought it wouldn’t fly, but it has, and high. Now with more than 400 members (my stepfather being one of them, which is how I came to know Zane), ARC just christened a new 6,000-square-foot facility complete with lifts that I checked out during my chat with Zane. Plans are afoot to expand by adding on two paint booths. ARC’s also a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. There isn’t another auto-themed club quite like it anywhere else in the United States.

ARC has had its hands in several projects since its founding, including the group’s first effort, the restoration of a 1901 Curved Dash Oldsmobile, which the club displays proudly in the new building. A 1936 Ford Phaeton just pulled in, about to be worked over. ARC also partnered up with nearby Dysart High School’s auto tech class, helping it build a 1968 Mercury Cougar that participated in the 2016 Great Race, a road rally from San Rafael, California, to Moline, Illinois. And then there’s the ARC Angels, a group that advises senior citizens in an effort to keep them from being preyed upon by unscrupulous dealers, repair shops, and others looking to take advantage of older folks.

As Clark spread the word to the ARC troops about Zane’s dream, they banded together to make it happen. Businesses donated parts, and many members toiled in the broiling desert sun to assemble it. Local paint specialists Premier Coach Works sprayed the Cheyenne up. When it was ready, they sprung a huge surprise, rolling the truck out onstage at the 2014 Barrett-Jackson auction in Scottsdale, stunning the young man.

After talking for a long while about cars and trucks, of course, we walked out to take a look at the C10. Others like short beds, but he’s a long-bed guy. “Feel how smooth this is,” he said as he had me run my hand over the bed, which had just been freshly waxed. He turned the stereo way, way up, and the bass thundered from the woofers lurking behind the back seats.

Like many his age, Zane is still undecided on his future. But the fact that he has a future to look forward to, and his truck to get him where he wants to go, is more than enough for now.




