It would probably not be a stretch if I made a blanket statement that most of us car nuts were into building model cars at one point in our lives. Well, Ron Guttu has taken model building to a much, much higher level! While most of the rest of us built our model cars from kits - maybe doing a custom piece here or there, or our own fancy paint jobs - the end result consisted of mostly parts from the kit. When we were done, the car looked very similar to the one on the cover photo of the kit box.



But not Ron. No sir. With patience that, I dare say, rivals that of Job, Ron spent 4 years building a ¼ scale model of a 1930's IMCA Dirt Track Race Car.... FROM SCRATCH! Nearly every part on this car was fabricated by Ron in either his home workshop or at the Metal Club. He even made his own tires by machining molds and pouring his own rubber! Oh yeah, one other difference between Ron's model car and the ones I built as a lad: Ron's car runs and drives! Yes, he fabricated the drivetrain too... all the way down to the custom functional carburetors which run best on methanol.

Ron couldn't help but be a mechanical car nut. From a very early age, his dad was a dirt track racer. Ron went with him to most races to help with the car, so he was exposed to all things mechanical in quick order. Back in the 30's, there wasn't much in the way of off the shelf racing parts, so Ron and his Dad either modified

existing parts to improve them, or fabricated new versions. They raced mostly around the Grand Forks, ND area that Ron grew up in. By the time the mid 50's rolled around, Ron's mechanical expertise took a new turn. He served 4 years in the Air Force as a maintenance crew chief on B-26 bombers. He spent about 20 months overseas, mostly in Korea and Japan. Fortunately, by this time, hostilities in Korea had ceased. Working on airplanes just enhanced Ron's mechanical skills even more.

Ron returned home after the service, and eventually got married to his bride Jeanne. He also started an automotive machine shop which he ran for about 35 years. Jeanne worked for many years at the University of North Dakota. They retired about 20 years ago and moved to SCW in 1999. Ron and Jeanne have two daughters. They also have 4 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

Over the years, Ron has had several cool cars. A couple of his favorites were a 1952 Cadillac Convertible and a 1958 Chrysler Convertible. But the car he wishes he still had more than any other is a mid-60's vintage Indy race car! He said he still cries when he thinks about selling that one!



Now we fast forward to today and Ron's "model car"... This started out as Ron finding the plans on the internet for a 270 Offy motor designed by Ron Colonna. Ron always wanted an Offy motor, so he purchased these plans to have the details with which to build a ¼ scale functioning copy of this

engine. Once he had the engine done, he needed a home for it. So that was when he got the idea to build a replica of the race car his dad raced back in the 30's. All he had to work off of was an old 4x6 photograph of his dad's car, but from that, he was able to get everything to scale. He even painted the car to match his dad's!

Most of the major pieces on the car were made out of polished stainless steel, so the chassis and suspension looks like chrome. He even built a "driver" for the car! This remote controlled man sits in the driver seat and can operate the pedals and steering! The attention to detail on this car is nothing short of amazing. Ron is a true craftsman and a very interesting guy to talk to. His wonderful creation garnered a centerfold feature story in the March / April 2008 edition of Model Engine Builder Magazine.



Ron intends on showing (and running!) the car from time to time at the ARC building, so if you ever have an opportunity to see it, you owe it to yourself to make the time. Oh, and in case you think Ron might be bored now, he has already started his next project: a ¼ scale midget race car with a 1 cubic inch engine!



## The ARC Angels

ARC and SCW residents are very fortunate to have the ARC Angels, led by Randy Robinson, in our community. The objective of the ARC Angels is to share the many hundreds of years of automotive experience the team members possess. They consult with residents on automotive concerns, values, and problems. Their goal is to answer automotive related questions and to insure that SCW residents are treated fairly in their dealings with local repair shops and those who wish to purchase their cars. The team's aim is to consult with SCW residents; not to fix or buy their vehicles. The Angels are available to all SCW residents.

The ARC Angels will help SCW residents:

A. Understand the value of a vehicle that needs to be sold or disposed of, and make the owner aware of some of the different methods the vehicle can be sold or otherwise handled in an honest and fair method.

B. Will assist local non-automotive knowledgeable residents with free advice about problems with their vehicles. Then give them information of possible places where they can receive honest/reputable repairs. Making sure they understand they should always get an estimate of repairs (in writing) before giving the OK to start any repairs or work.

C. Will assist in other ways with questions and concerns related to SCW residents' vehicles.

The ARC Angels work quietly, behind the scenes and don't ask for recognition. Recently several letters of thanks have been received showing appreciation for actions of the ARC Angels. We want to share some of these letters.

On January 9, 2016, Mildred & Bob McClain wrote: *We were having a real problem with a car repair shop. Your ARC Angels stepped in and made sure we got treated fair. We received over \$600 back on what was a truly poor repair job on our SUV. We were also given a name of a shop that completed the repair correctly for much less than the prior shop. We*

*contacted Randy Robinson of the ARC Angels and he worked with us through the entire experience. Thank you so very much.*

On January 13, 2016 this note was received: *Thank you for the loan of unit heaters. They helped keep us warm after our recent home electrical fire. Fred & Vivian Mathew.* Randy Robinson said that after the Mathews had an electrical fire on a Friday, they had no way to stay warm over the weekend until they could get repairs on Monday. They contacted the ARC Angels for help. Randy rounded up some portable heaters to get them through the weekend. He said he knew this wasn't a vehicle related problem but they needed help.

On January 16, 2016, this note was received:

*Dear ARC Members, It is difficult for me to express my deep thanks for the wonderful support that the people of ARC have extended to me after the death of my husband, Terry Peterson. During his illness, there was no end to the generous offers of help. The same delightful group did not stop there. When he passed away, I was surrounded with those who gave unstintingly of their time and efforts when Terry's garage NEEDED cleaning and the pick-up required a great deal of expertise to repair. His unfinished '39 Ford is way beyond anything that I could ever attempt to deal with. I honestly do not know what I would have done without the ARC Angels. It would have been disastrous. 

## MEMBERS' RIDES BY Dwight Senne

*Editor's Note. Each month we are planning to feature an ARC member's ride. We hope you will enjoy it. We would love to feature yours. Tell us about it!*

In 1969, current ARC member Gary Alwes was 17 years old and convinced his dad to take him to the local Ford dealer to buy a new Mustang. When they walked in, there was a Boss 302 and a 428 CJ Mustang on the showroom floor. Gary fell in love with the Boss and told his dad that was the car he wanted. After looking at the interior, dad said no. As with all Boss' this car had a 4 speed and his dad said it's too dangerous. So Gary settled for a '69 Mach 1 (poor guy!) with an auto trans.

Just 2 years later, Gary had to sell his beloved Mach 1 because he was headed off to Vietnam. By the time he got back in 1974, the muscle car era was pretty much over. Gary ended up back in Illinois, got married, and got a great job he held for 37 years. Muscle cars were a thing of the past for him. In early 2012, after retiring, Gary moved to Sun City West. Soon after, he started getting the itch for a Mustang again. This time, it was his call, and he was not going to be denied his Boss!

Finally, in April 2015, Gary found this beautifully re-stored original 1970 Boss 302 G code Mustang in South Carolina. The restoration was very professionally done, right down to the original decals and paint codes. Speaking of paint, the Calypso Coral paint color on this beauty really makes it stand out (as if the Boss 302 markings don't do enough of that!). The bulk of the restoration work was done about 2005 and the car mostly sat in storage for the next 10 years prior to Gary buying it.



The original Boss 302 G code engine was, as many muscle cars were in the day, underrated at 290 HP from the factory, but subsequent dyno tests indicate these engines were closer to 380 HP. The top loader 4 speed carries that power back to the 3.50:1 posi-traction rear end. Other than rebuilding the carb and going through the entire fuel system, the car remains as Gary bought it.... Except for about 3000 more miles on the odometer!

As I said, the restoration is near factory perfect (probably better!), and is one of the cleanest cars I have ever seen!
