Here's the inside information on the raffle: On April 26th ARC was able to purchase an immaculate, low mileage, 1991 ZR-1 Corvette from ARC member Greg Johnson for \$16K. If you haven't seen this Corvette, stop by the ARC building and give it a close look, you can even sit in it. Also, while you are there, purchase your tickets to win this beauty! Each ticket is \$20, or you may purchase six of them for the bargain price of \$100. If you say you don't want a Corvette, well, how about \$10K CASH??? That's right you don't have to take the Corvette, you can claim the cash instead.

Thus far, ARC has collected over \$9K in ticket sales. That's a great start, but keep in mind the break even point is \$16K for the Corvette. That means ARC still needs to sell a lot of tickets just to hit that number and, of course, make a profit. Those profits fund the next raffle vehicle and pay down the debt on the ARC building which cur-

rently stands at \$564,974.86. That debt is directly payable to the Rec. Center of SCW and is in the form of a duly signed Note by ARC. It's the Club's promise to pay back in full what was loaned to the club in order to build the ARC building.

The drawing will be held on or before February 12, 2022, at 2:00 PM. That is the date of our 10th Annual Car Show & Swap Meet. Gary Masak will again be the Car Show Chairman, but it takes

NEW LIFE DIRECTION AND PURPOSE FOR ME

The Back Story to Behind the Wheel

After 45 years of intense involvement in all things Porsche, I have taken an off -ramp and made a 90degree turn toward the British side of the English Channel. I have owned eight different Porsches, participated in many Porsche Club of America track days, autocrosses, rallies, concours and social events. I have served as a Porsche Club Officer and as a National Porsche Club Concours Judge. It was very often life and time consuming, but it was also great fun, for sure. However, I do believe in recent years Porsche has become just another Motor Car Company selling lots of SUV's, Tesla knock-offs and \$150K+ track day sports cars to wealthy snobs. So, I'm out.

We had a 1998 Jaguar XJ8 which was turned in for

a European Tourist Delivery BMW in 2001. My wife, Elaine, never quite forgave me for parting with her Jag even though driving around in Europe for six weeks in the Bimmer was great fun and most enjoyable. Anyway, after 20 some years and four BMWs and a Mercedes, we returned to the Jaguar fold with a 2021 XF Saloon (English for sedan) last Spring. The XF competes with BMW 5-series, Mercedes E-class and Audi A6 plus other mid-size sport sedans. The Jaguar is more delicate and refined yet is much more agile and fun to drive than its German counterparts, more BMW like than any of the others. The Jag is some 500 pounds lighter, made mostly of aluminum, and \$10K cheaper to buy, a no brainer for me.

Recently, while searching

the internet, I just happened onto a 2014 Jaguar F-Type V8 S sports car which was a one-owner, Arizona car sold and serviced at the local Jaguar dealership in Scottsdale. It was on consignment at a specialty dealer shop. The original owner had surgery and had not been able to drive the car for two years before deciding to part with it. I made them a "Let's just trade keys" offer for my 30-yearold Porsche 911 and the Jag F-Type and it was accepted. We shook hands and the deal was done. Did I really mean to do this, I asked myself? Well and Hell, yes!

The F-Type is a 22-year upgrade from the 1992 Porsche and sounds like a British Corvette. It has a 5-liter, supercharged V8 (look out Mustang GTs) and an 8-



speed ZF automatic gear box. I am amazed how modern yet how visceral the car is to drive. I am having to relearn about understeer with front mounted engines after years of driving tail happy Porsches with the engine hanging out back.




