her hip. She got another ac-





2023 DREAM CAR RAFFLE CAR SHOW & SWAP MEET

Here's the inside information on the 2023 Raffle Vehicle: On April 26th ARC was able to purchase an immaculate, low mileage, 2011 Camaro Convertible that is red with a black interior for \$17.4K. If you haven't seen the Camaro, stop by the ARC building and give it a close look, you can even sit in it. Also, while you are there, purchase your tickets to win this beauty! Each ticket is \$20, or you may purchase six of them for the bargain price of \$100. If you say you don't want a Camaro. well. how about \$10K CASH??? That's right you don't have to take the Camaro, you can claim the cash instead.

Thus far, ARC has collected almost \$9K in ticket sales. That's a great start,

but keep in mind, we are not yet at the break-even point. We have 5,000 tickets to sell. That means ARC still needs to sell a lot of tickets to sell in order to make a profit. Those profits fund the next raffle vehicle and pay down the debt on the ARC building which currently stands at \$474,974.86. That debt is directly payable to the Rec. Center of SCW and is in the form of a duly signed Note by ARC. It's the Club's promise to pay back in full what was loaned to the club in order to build the ARC building and Paint Shop.

The drawing will be held on February 11, 2023, at 2:00 PM. That is the date of our 11th Annual Car Show & Swap Meet which happens to be one day prior to the Super Bowl here in Phoenix. Gary Masak will again be the Car Show Chair-



man, but it takes over 100 volunteers to make the Car Show & Swap Meet happen.

Car Show planning meetings are scheduled to begin on September 13th in the Social Hall East. Gary has already been out soliciting for trophy and show sponsors. 


