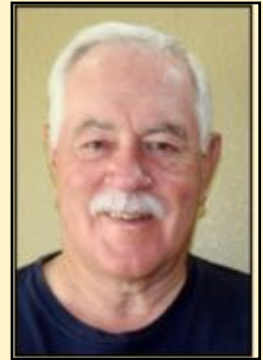

We Can All Do Better!



The world today is unfortunately not what most of us grew up knowing! It has changed. We need people who are unselfish and willing to help others...without being asked! I was blessed this last year by a man and his group of people who helped me help others. Here is the story.

Some of you are aware that I am an Ambassador for RPM Foundation (Restoration, Preservation and Mentorship). This has been a very rewarding opportunity that was given to me in 2013. The RPM Foundation knew of my love for cars and helping youth get involved. Along the way I have been fortunate to have met some incredible people. Here is one story that needs to be told.

A few years ago at a Great Race, I met a man who asked me about RPM and how to get involved. In the middle of the Great Race, he asked me if I could help him out. He needed a Navigator to complete the trip. I wasn't able to help him, but we have stayed in touch. Last year he brought a truck from the Early Ford Museum in Auburn, Indiana to SCW to compete in the Cactus Derby. I got to know Craig Floyd and the rest of his race team a lot better. Craig is always asking, "What can I do to help?" I talked to him about RPM and the X- CUP Division. Craig and the Early Ford Museum had sponsored an X-CUP team in 2022.

In our conversations before the Cactus Derby, I had mentioned I was working with St. Louis Community College Automotive School putting together an X-Cup Team. He asked how it was going. We did not have a car for the students to compete in yet. He immediately said, "No Problem! We can take care of that." Craig and the Early Ford Museum loaned STLCC a 1951 Ford they had fixed up, complete with the special speedometer and all the other things needed to compete in the Great Race. Unbelievable! In addition, they trailered it to the Great Race start in St Augustine, Florida, and then hauled it back to Auburn once the race was over!

The act of kindness was more evident when the Early Ford Museum hosted a 2 1/2 day Great Race Rally in Auburn, Indiana. I had never been to their museum, but I WILL GO BACK AGAIN. This is quite an area for anyone who loves cars. Their hospitality and organization made for the BEST rally I have ever attended. We need more people like them.

Craig and his team were very complimentary of ARC. ARC is near and dear to my heart. I sincerely hope ARC can be as friendly and helpful as Craig Floyd and all the people at the Early Ford Museum. HERE IS A KICKER! The Early Ford Museum is GIVING a 1941 Ford Coupe to STLCC students for future Great Races! They are fixing it up before they hand over the keys! PEOPLE ARE GREAT! Gary and Gloria Jones (#90/#194)



Gary Jones was born in Kansas City, Kansas but grew up in Parkville, Missouri. He and Gloria, his wife of 55 years, were snow birds from 2009 to 2018 but are now full-time residents. An ARC member since 2012, Gary monitors frequently as well as teaches formally and informally.

He carried a badge with the Phoenix Police Department for several months in the early 1970's while in charge of software development for PPD. The US Department of Justice required that anyone having access to criminal history be a sworn officer. Shortly after he was issued the badge, DOJ changed the rules, so he had to give it up. Since 9/11/2001 he has attended more than 500 funerals as a member of the Patriot Guard for members of our Armed Forces who have perished in the War on Terror.

In addition to working full time for Ford Motor Company, his father owned an auto repair business. At about age eight, he began working in the shop cleaning and organizing tools. Then at about twelve, he was responsible for cleaning parts and preparing them for re-installation. At about fifteen, he started, under his father's supervision, doing tune-ups, brake work, and carburetor overhauls. Later, with his older brother, he completed engine overhauls. In high school he built several drag racing engines for friends. Also in high school, he was in a "cooperative education" program where he worked afternoons for a heavy truck dealership in their service and paint departments, as well as evenings and weekends in his father's shop. His working career was in software development.

Gary's favorite car was his '66 Fairlane GT that he bought new while in high school. His dream car is his current street rod that he dreamed of constructing most of his forty-year career in software development. Gloria helped him construct the street rod, fly and maintain aircrafts, build and remodel houses, and ride motorcycles. Gloria's favorite ride continues to be her 2002 Harley Davidson Fatboy; she has put more than 60,000 miles on it riding throughout the USA.

Downshifting Jim and Kathy Swanson by Ed Zacko and Jim Swanson

Jim Swanson (#195) grew up in the small town of Galesburg, Illinois, a rural area just about 45 miles east of the Mississippi River. Kathy (#242) hails from Peoria, Illinois. They met in college, Jim attending Wesleyan U in Bloomington, and Kathy at Illinois State U in neighboring Normal. They married in 1972, and in 1974 moved from Illinois to Phoenix, where Jim took a job in Personnel with the Paradise Valley School District. Their family began in June of 1976 with the birth of twin daughters Sarah and Carissa. In 1977 they moved back to Peoria, Illinois to be closer to their families. Their time in Peoria also saw the arrival of two sons, Eric and Adam.

Jim took a job with Caterpillar Tractor Co. (CAT) in 1978, and after working in the Peoria area a few years, became a National Trainer for CAT, traveling extensively throughout the U.S. He was eventually promoted to a field rep position, covering northern California and Nevada, based out of the northern California Bay area.

“Talk about a culture shock – moving from Peoria, Illinois to the Bay area with four young kids and a dog! WHEW! We lived in Clayton, CA which is in Contra Costa County, about 35 miles east of San Francisco. My job required me to be “on the road” quite a bit, so Kathy was left “holding down the fort” while I travelled my territory. We loved the Clayton area, so when CAT wanted to transfer me back to Peoria, I left CAT, Kathy left her job, and ‘on a wing and a prayer’, we started our own business from scratch in the service industry.”

Retiring back in Arizona had always been in the back of their minds, and in 2003, they bought a condo in Sun City to get away for occasional long weekends. Their arrival in Sun City West came in 2004 with the purchase of a house on Heritage Drive. Never thinking it was time to retire, Jim got his real estate agent’s license, and Kathy went to work for Safeway as an Accounting Manager.

Jim truly enjoyed his ‘encore career’ in real estate, and in 2011 upgraded to the real estate broker’s license. He continues to remain active in real estate today with HomeSmart Realty. Kathy retired in 2016.

“I always had a fascination for cars. With two older sisters and an older brother, there were plenty of older guys hanging around our house, so in the late 50’s and 60’s I was always “checking out their rides”. My Dad was a staunch Ford man, and in 1964 my parents bought one of the first Ford Mustangs that came to our area. And of course, that’s what I drove for my license test the day I turned 16. When I was a senior in high school, my folks traded that car in for a new ’67 Mustang convertible. That’s all it took – I was hooked. At that same time, one of my sisters had a hunter green ’66 Mustang coupe, and as he was wrapping up college, my older brother snagged a new ’67 Mustang GT500....midnight blue with white Daytona stripes. WOW! What a car that was! Needless to say, I’ve been a Mustang guy all my life!”

While still with CAT in California, they bought a used '67 Mustang coupe just to rekindle that long-standing loyalty. This was the car their daughters drove when they got their licenses. Later came an early production, very tired, '64 ½ coupe. "We literally had to cut down a small tree that had been growing through its engine compartment in order to haul it out of a guy's backyard. I think every car guy has a story about the one they let get away. Mine was a Candy Apple Red, '66 Mustang fastback GT - a four-barrel, four-speed car with a parchment Pony interior. It even had an AM/FM cassette player that worked! (It came with an old Jose Feliciano tape in it... remember "Come On Baby Light My Fire"???)" In a moment of weakness, Jim deviated from his loyalty to Fords and on a whim, bought an '87 Mercedes 560SL convertible. "Boy are those cars expensive to maintain and repair!

"I drove our '67 convertible to college. One of my favorite memories of that car (that I can relay here) was that it was chosen as the parade car for our IWU Homecoming queen. Remember just how short the skirts were in 1968? Yep, I do!" A little known fact about that model Mustang is that the passenger side vent housing opens and closes with a small door beneath the dash. The cavity inside that door is just large enough to hold a fifth of bourbon. Needless to say, Jim and friends bought a lot of Cokes and Seven-Ups in college when they went cruisin'!

During their daughters' high school years, Jayson, one of their friends, worked part-time in a gas station. A lady came in asking Jason if he would help her get an old car started - she needed to get it out of a garage so she could sell it. Jason sold her a new battery, and on his lunch hour, volunteered to go to her house just around the corner to install it. He delivered the battery and that "Candy Apple Red '67 convertible" started right up! Later that day Jason conveyed the story to the girls. They acquired that car and kept it for over 39 years, as the "someday maybe machine." The car had spent its entire life in northern California, where we're certain it enjoyed every sunny day in the Bay area's 1967 "*Summer of Love*", and even many happy times after that.

"We had it shipped over here to SCW when we moved here full time, and even though it looked tired, Kathy and I still enjoyed taking day trips in it. It's been "standin' on the corner" with us in Winslow, and on numerous trips around the Valley - and even to several Cruisin' Grand events when those were held on Central Avenue downtown. One afternoon we drove it up to Jerome, and while making our way back down the hill, it became all-too-obvious the old original drum brakes weren't safe. Talk about a white-knuckle ride! YIKES! So, converting to new disc brakes was one of only a very few modifications we've made to the Pony."

"Since I've always loved Mustangs, I guess I only have a very few cars that I wish we owned - a white '65 Mustang GT350 fastback, a lime gold '68 GT500 KR convertible with a Cobra Jet 428, and a 2024 Mustang GTD (I keep telling Kathy that those are only going to be priced at about \$300K). Hey, a guy can dream, can't he? Kathy tells me to just keep on dreaming, and she reminds me that we also don't now and never will have a five-car garage. Shucks!"

"The 'revitalization' project of our Pony is still in progress. It's so great to have a facility like ARC so that we and others are able to do things to vehicles that we'd never have been able to tackle otherwise. But even greater is the amazing depth of knowledge and experience of our members. The camaraderie and willingness to share knowledge, tips, and a helping hand is world-class! Through the years, I've been involved with many organizations here in SCW - ARC is fantastic."

Now in their 51st year of marriage, they are still going strong! In addition to working daily in the ARC shop on the “Candy Apple Red Mustang,” Kathy has just completed her third term as Board Secretary of ARC and Jim, through HomeSmart Realty, continues to be a long time trophy sponsor for ARC’s annual Car Show.

“Kathy and I have enjoyed many pleasurable ARC experiences over the years but the one that stands out most is our participation in the “ARC Cop’s Cruise.” The memory of a few hundred cars showing up on that beautiful sunny day still reminds me just how proud Kathy and I are of being members of our club and our community, and the values many of us here in this area share.”

September General Meeting Notes

Concerning the meeting, it was mentioned that the current ARC membership is just shy of 700 members. With 80+ members in attendance, the 10% requirement for a quorum was met in order to vote on the purchase of two new lifts for the club.

Tom discussed with the membership an approval to spend up to \$20,000 to replace two lifts in the shop. One lift, originally purchased as a used piece of equipment when ARC first opened, has reached the point where it no longer makes economic sense to repair. The other lift was a four-post cable lift that really isn't suited for the type of use it receives.

The motion passed, and work is in progress to obtain and install two new lifts.

Waste Water Rates - Update Signatures Due by October 5, 2023 at 3:00pm MST

PORA members, Sun City West residents & Corte Bella Residents! Your assistance is needed immediately in assisting PORA in resisting a substantial wastewater rate increase in a case brought by EPCOR, and to be determined by the Arizona Corporation Commission. Commencing Tuesday, 26 September 2023, I ask you to stop by PORA to sign a petition, email your response or click the link below and enter your information which will be submitted to the Commission. It argues the following:

1. Sun City West residents are retired and live on fixed incomes.
2. Sun City West residents do not live in the immediate geographical locus of development that drives EPCOR's wish for a wastewater rate increase.
3. Sun City West argues that a three-tier system of rates are fair, equitable, and place the preponderance of the rates on the prime COST CAUSERS, to wit: Commercial and Industrial enterprises, rather than Residential.

The three-tier system would be assessed as follows; Commercial, Industrial, and Residential, in that descending order.

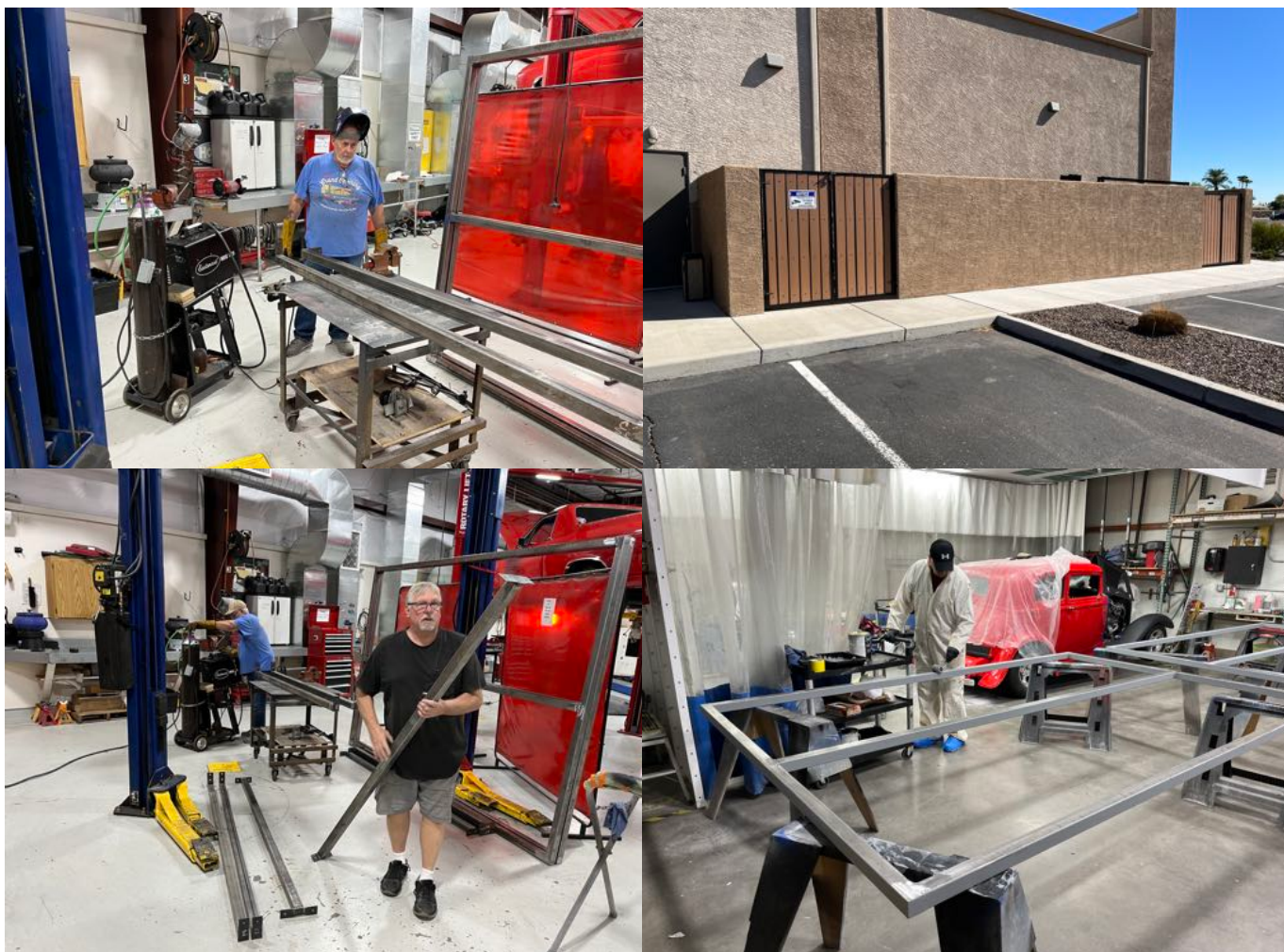

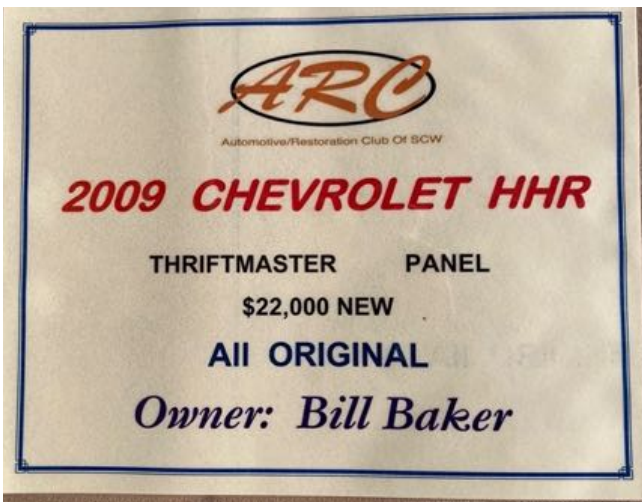

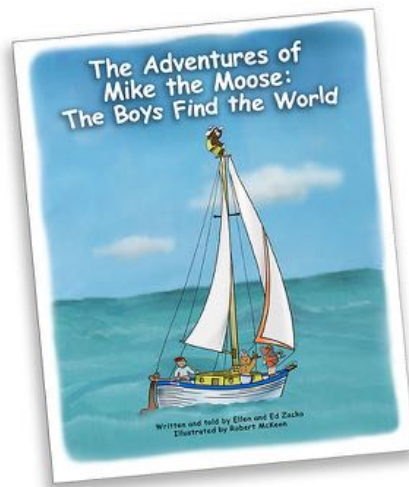
