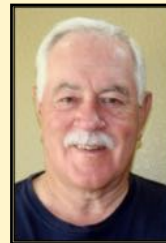
We are still having our Coffee 'N Cars the last Saturday of the month and our Western Bank Mini Car Show has been moved to the third Friday of the month.

Founder's Focus A Column by Herb Clark



On Saturday April 13, 22 teams enjoyed a spectacular day competing in the Great Race like competition put on by the RPM Foundation. The 22 cars included 15 student teams representing St. Louis Community College, and joining the competition this year, Ranken Technical College Automotive students and faculty. The "Fun Run" is a tune up for the actual Great Race competition in June. The Great Race this year will start in Owensville, KY and finish in Gardiner, ME. Last year STLCC competed in the big event and finished a very respectable 4th place in the X Cup Division despite some frequent mechanical issues in their classic 1951 Ford.

The teams met in Columbia, Illinois and traversed along a course designed to be tough, but the main objective was to prepare them for the big race in June. The participants left the "Start" in one-minute intervals following "Course Instructions" around the rural area. Along the way they found three checkpoints strategically placed. This is a time and distance event where the Driver must drive at set speeds, while the Navigator studies the Course Instructions in order to traverse around the course. Object: Be at the checkpoint at the exact calculated second! If you are early or late you are given a penalty point for each second early or late!

The group met after the competition at a restaurant in Columbia and shared stories of their adventures of the day. The top three place winners are:

Driver: 1st Nathan Depelhuer 2nd Mike Whitcraft 3rd Larry Beyler

Navigator: 1st Will Van Kirk 2nd Ella Whitcraft 3rd Jim Denny

We were pleased to have several others join us in the competition! Dr. Julie Fickas, STLCC President, was the Navigator for Don Kloth (Great Race veteran) in Don's well-traveled 1930 Model A Speedster. Three members of the Missouri Valley Model A Club joined the group: Bill Schafer and Gene Roehl teamed up, and Don Pfitzinger and a friend competed in Don's "Pickle" Speedster.

I would like to thank everyone who participated and helped in putting on this event. It is a lot of work, but it is worth seeing the friendly competition, and seeing the students of our local area schools competing. These young men and women are the ones who someday soon will be keeping our cars on the road! We thank Ranken Tech for joining us this year and hope to see them next year in the Great Race.

Downshifting Mike Harwell (#1540) by Ed Zacko

Mike Harwell grew up in northern Illinois with three sisters and one brother. His father, a mechanic, owned the local family service station which introduced Mike to the automotive world. At the young age of 13, Mike was doing the tire repairs at his Dad's garage and quickly made his way from there. "I have had a love for cars ever since!"

Mike's first car, a '63 Mercury Comet 4-door, was given to him by his father and needed a lot of engine work. "It was an ugly car for a 16 year-old but, it was a "gift from Dad!"

He rebuilt the engine and cleaned the car from front to back. "It was really filthy and I asked my dad if I could sell it and get a '66 Pontiac Le Mans that I had my eye on?"

Mike and his dad went to look at the car, which had a big dent in the passenger door, and talked the seller down to \$700. Mike sold the Comet for \$500 and worked off the difference in the garage. He drove the Le Mans for a few years and when he told his dad he wanted to buy an Opel GT (the poor man's Corvette), "The look on his face was priceless!" Upon looking at the GT his father said: "What would you want with that?" and quickly persuaded Mike to buy a '72 Buick GS, which eventually became his "favorite car!"

Mike achieved Master Certification from The GM Training Center in Hinsdale, IL and went to work for Buick, Oldsmobile, Pontiac, Cadillac, Chevrolet and the GM Hydramatic Division. He retired from the auto industry in 1998. Mike arrived at ARC with a gorgeous orange '69 Camaro SS that he had completely restored.

When asked, if you could have any other car, what would it be? "It would be a McLaren Speedtail if I didn't have to pay for it." Mike is now a regular fixture in the shop working on his latest project, a Shelby Cobra replica. "I've only recently started working in the shop, but the friends I've met only reassures me we made the right choice in the place to retire.

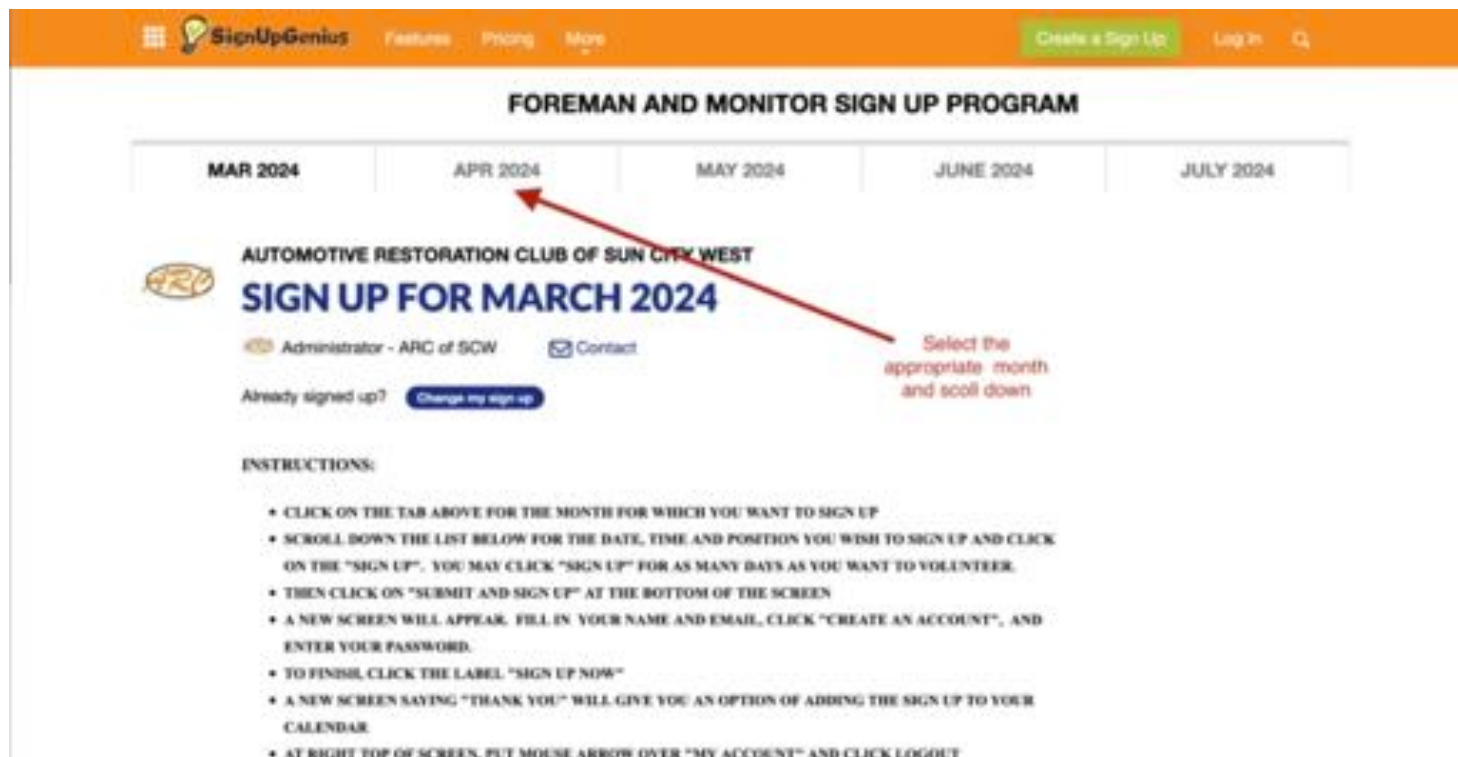

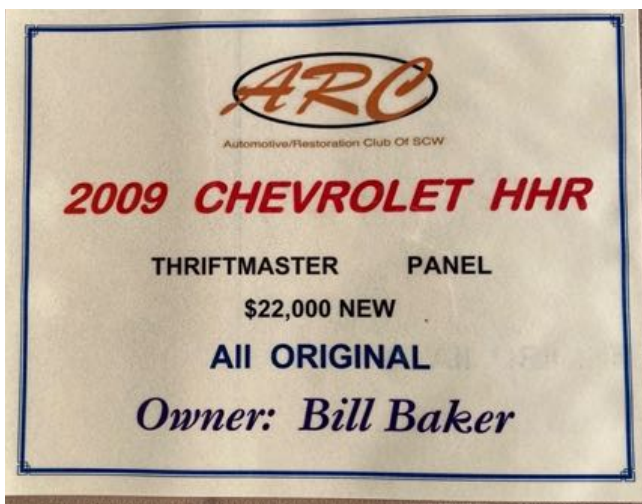

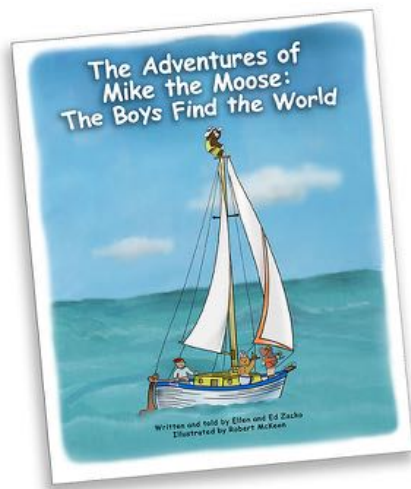
